

ACASA 2018 SANE TRAINING

March 2nd, 8th, 16th, 22nd & 30th

(Overview)

Courses will begin on March 2nd through March 30th. The training days required for completion are March 2nd, 8th, 16th, 22nd, and 30th. During these days we will go over the information needed and required to start the process of becoming a certified SANE-A (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner-Adolescent/Adult). The training will be from 8-5pm, unless changed, and will also be using Telemedicine through the UAMS Telemedicine line (awaiting approval/response).

We are working with a SANE as our Consultant who will also be teaching this course work to all RN's, APN's, and yes even MD's. This training will grant the attendees 40Hrs of CEUs that are required through the DOJ and IAFN, International Association of Forensic Nurses, when becoming a SANE-A. Upon completion of this Didactic Coursework the students are also required to complete Preceptorship hours until deemed proficient. Since Arkansas does not have any laws or requirements in place to be specific in the amount of hours needed to complete these clinical/simulation hours, it is left to the students' supervisors to deem them proficient.

In this training the students will learn hands on approaches when working with a Sexual Assault Patient, as well as learn more of how the brain functions during a crisis through the educational means of the Neurobiology of Trauma approach. Not only that, but the students will also learn about Arkansas Law, History of Forensic Nursing, Forensics, Scope of Practice, Certification Process, Community Outreach through education, awareness and prevention, Victims with Disabilities, the Elderly, Human Trafficking, the Tanner Stages, Victimology, and so much more. This training will prepare the students to be thoroughly educated on the subject in all aspects.

Below is a break down agenda of each day and a summation of what each will look like.

Day 1 (March 2): Review Pretest, History, Scope of Practice, Certification Process, Professional Organizations, State Attorney Presentation, Multidisciplinary Team (MDT)/Sexual Assault Response Teams (SART), Myths, Informed Consent/Confidentiality, Community Education, Awareness, and Prevention.

Day 2 (March 8): Role of SANE, Role of Law Enforcement, Neurobiology of Trauma, Abusers & Offender Typology, SART Dynamics, Victimology, Homework.

Day 3 (March 16): Injuries and Documentation/Strangulation and Bite Marks, Intimate Partner Violence, Mandated Reporting, Elder Abuse, Military Assaults, Alcohol/Drug Facilitated Sexual Assault, Forensics, Effects of CSA/ACE.

Day 4 (March 22): Pediatric/Adolescent Exam, Tanner Stages, Colposcope, Forensic Photography, Advocate Presentation, Victims with Disabilities, Human Trafficking, Sexual Assault Kit Review.

Day 5 (March 30): Cultural Diversity, Medicolegal History Taking, Documentation, Injury Identification, Clinical Requirements, Discharge Procedures and Beyond, Sexually Transmitted Infections, Emergency Contraception, Prophylactic Antibiotics, Survivors Story, Post-test and Evaluations.

Clinical Simulation Day (TBA): Review Expectations, Pair SANE Trainees with Forensic Associate, Review Scenario with students, SANE trainees complete mock sexual assault exam with FTA (self-paced, recorded/observed), Collect sexual assault evidence kit, Forensic Photography (practice), Speculum technique for use in adult population, Review consent and reporting with FTAP, Post conference: discuss findings, follow-up, testing, and conclusion: review strengths, techniques, questions, policy, and overall care of victim.
